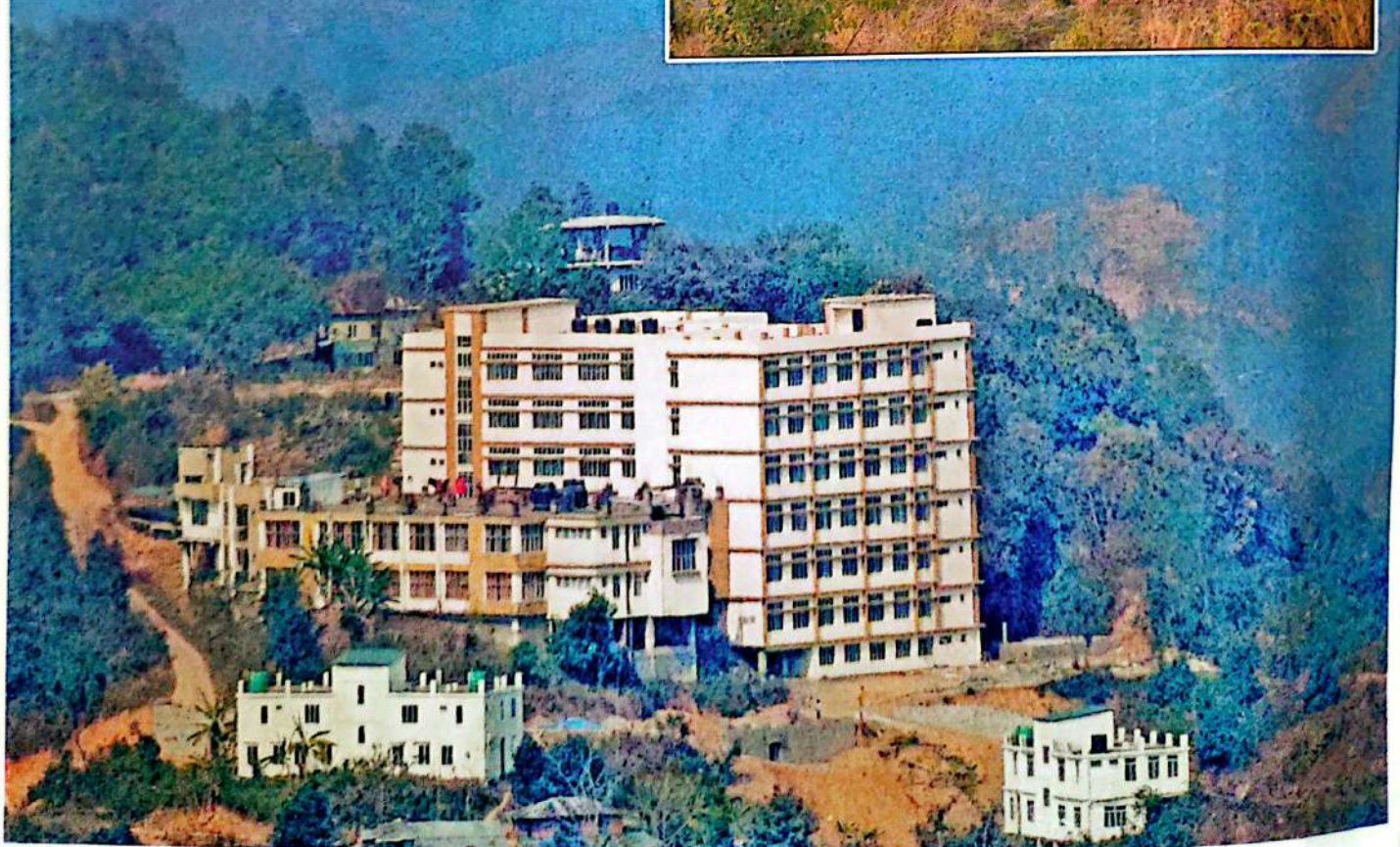




Sikulpuikawn Campus

## ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Government Aizawl College was established on the January 13, 1975 as a private Arts College and added to it were Commerce and Science Streams in 1986 and 1988 respectively. Science Stream was detached from the college in 2001 following the policy of the Government of Mizoram to amalgamate Science Stream in the Government Zirtiri Residential Science College, Aizawl.

The college was recognised by the University Grants Commission (UGC) on March 17, 1987 under Section 2f and 12B of UGC Act, 1956 and was taken over by the Government of Mizoram on January 1, 1989.

The college was first affiliated to the North Eastern Hill University (NEHU), Shillong on the July 15, 1975. When the Mizoram University was established, automatically it was affiliated to the Mizoram University on July 2, 2001. The College was awarded B+ in 2004 and 'B' in 2011, and was awarded 'B+' in 2016 by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC).

The college offers Under Graduate Degree Courses in the Arts and Commerce Streams. There are eight departments in the Arts Stream, which are English, Mizo, Hindi, History, Political Science, Education, Economics and Sociology. The college also offers the Post Graduate Course in Education from 2021 - 2022 sessions with a permission from Mizoram University (No. MZU/CDC-3/9/21/2569, dated Aizawl, the 17th March, 2021).

At present, there are 41 Regular Teachers, 2 RUSA Teachers, 7 Contract Teachers, 3 PT Teachers and 3 Casual Teachers. Altogether, there are 56 teaching staffs in Government Aizawl College. There are 3 professors and 18 doctorate degree holders.

The academic programmes include IGNOU Study Centre, Certificate Course in Insurance and National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT) Study Centre. The college has 2 campuses, the Old Campus is at Sikulpuikawn, which is centrally located and easily accessible to the public and the New Campus is located at Mualpui, Salem Veng, which is at the beautiful and pleasant countryside in the picturesque city of Aizawl. Both campuses provides a congenial atmosphere for serious studies.

## MOTTO

The motto of the College is '*Labor Omnia Vincit*'. It is a Latin phrase meaning '*Work conquers all*'



## VISION

The college aims to live up to the motto 'Labor Omnia Vincit' which means 'labour conquers all'. It symbolizes the act of working hard in order to achieve success in all areas of life. It is established to educate and disseminate awareness on the virtues of labour to the students. Providing a suitable environment for achieving all-round development of the students is a major goal of the college.

  - ii) Construction of Administrative and Academic Building consisting a number of Classrooms, Library, Conference Hall and Faculty Rooms which is funded by NLCPR (under the DONER Ministry) has been completed.

  - iv) Men's Hostel funded by RUSA with a capacity of 12 seats.



## ADMISSION PROCEDURE

### 1) General Information

- a) Subject to availability of seats, admission to the College is open to all the eligible candidates without any discrimination
- b) A notification for admissions to the College shall be announced and advertised to the public whereby online application forms are to be obtained from the college website.
- c) The duly filled-in Application Form, along with the following documents must be submitted on or before the stipulated date of the submission mentioned.

### 2) Eligibility for Admission

- a) Pass in the Higher Secondary Examination or its equivalent conducted by any recognised board of the State or the Central Government.
- b) For admission to Commerce Stream, a candidate must have passed in the relevant subject.

### 3) Documents required for Admission Application

- a) Each Admission Application must be accompanied by:
  - i) Attested copy/photocopy of HSLC Marksheet and Certificate
  - ii) Attested copy/photocopy of HSSLC Marksheet and Certificate
  - iii) A recent passport size photograph of the students
  - iv) A recent digital photograph with size less than 30kb (for Online Application)
  - v) Testimonial and Transfer Certificate from the institution last attended with BPL/PWD Certificate, if necessary
- b) The College will follow Mizoram University norms or guidelines. However, meritorious students will be granted admission on priority basis. The criteria of admission rests solely on the authority of the Admission Committee, which may exercise its own terms and conditions to be duly notified to the applicants at the time of admissions.

### 4) Admission Procedure for Foreign Students

Foreign students must have legal visa and permission for entry into the country. The college bears no responsibility for the admission of students without the legal permissions seeking admission to the college.

### 5) Seat Reservation

The college have seat reservation for the Adopted Village (Hmuifang) and Salem Veng for new admission.

CERTIFICATION

Reservation as governed by the Constitution of India is adopted by the State of Mizoram. As per Government of India Reservation Policy which is adopted by the State of Mizoram, Govt. Colleges in Mizoram have reserve seats as follows: Sc-15%, ST-7.5% and OBC-27% during 2016-17, 2017-18, 2018-19, 2019-20 and 2020-21.

However, since Mizoram is Tribal Area, majority of applicants seeking admission in the College are Mizos belonging to Scheduled Tribe, the surplus seats allotted for general and other reserved category may be allotted to the Scheduled Tribe applicants.

## REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE CHOICE-BASED CREDIT AND GRADING SYSTEM IN UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMMES

### 1) General Information

- a) The Under Graduate Courses shall consist of three academic years with two semesters in each year. The first academic year shall comprise of the first and second semesters, the second academic year — the third and fourth semesters and the third academic year — the fifth and sixth semesters.
- b) Each semester shall carry 400 marks and the total marks for the entire course shall be 2400 for BA and each semester shall carry 400/500 marks. The total marks for the entire course of B.Com shall be 2800.
- c) Two class tests and an assignment/seminar/project carrying 12 marks and 8 marks each shall be conducted in each paper for continuous assessment. The remaining 5 marks shall be allotted to the attendance of the student.
- d) A candidate has to earn a minimum of 140 credits [Foundation Courses (FC) 20, Major Core Courses (CC) 72 and the Elective Core Courses (EC) 48] for successful completion of undergraduate degree.
- e) A candidate shall register his/her name in the Mizoram University in the first semester.
- f) The Odd Semester (I, III, V) is scheduled from July to December and the Even Semester (II, IV, VI) from January to June. End-semester examinations shall be conducted twice each year — November for odd semesters and May for even semesters.
- g) The working days for each semester shall not be less than 90 days excluding holidays, sports/examination/semester break/vacation, if any.

### 2) Attendance

A minimum of 75% attendance is required if a student is to be sent up for the final examination. A student having less than the required percentage of attendance as per the university norms is liable to be barred from appearing the University Examination.

Attendance evaluation for each course shall be given as follows as per the Mizoram University norms:

A candidate shall be permitted to continue from the First Semester up to the Final Semester irrespective of his/her failure in any of the semester examination subject to the condition that the candidate shall appear for all the arrear papers of each course(s) along with the concerned semester examinations.

### 3) Conduct of Examinations

- a) End-Semester Examinations are conducted as per the Mizoram University guidelines at the end of every semester.
- b) Each course shall be evaluated at the scale of 100. For all courses, irrespective of theory and practical, there shall be continuous internal assessment carrying 25 marks and an end-semester examination carrying 75 marks.
- c) A candidate shall be permitted multiple attempts/chances to clear pending paper(s) [back/repeat paper(s)] within the total course duration of five years. (2016 Syllabus. ix (V.4) xviii (XI.6) & Notification: Resolution No. AC:30:4(20)(5)-19<sup>th</sup> Aug. 2016)
- d) In any case, a student shall not be allowed to repeat a course for the component of the internal assessment.
- e) Improvement Examination shall be given only once during the programme duration (3+2 years) totaling to 10 semesters/5 years:
- f) A candidate who passed Bachelor Degree Examinations may be permitted to re-appear in the examination for improvement in the theory paper. However, a candidate is allowed to give improvement for a maximum of 2 papers for Pre-CBCS candidates and 1 paper/course in the CBCS Programme.
- g) A student is eligible for Improvement only after passing the Final/6<sup>th</sup> Semester. However, a student is not allowed to take improvement beyond 10 (ten) semesters, counting from the enrolment.
- h) A candidate appearing for improvement shall not be entitled to get any Prize/Rank/Medal/Scholarship Award.



- i) The question paper will contain objective/multiple choice, short answer and descriptive type questions. The distribution of marks will be as follows:

Section A	10 Questions - 10x1 marks = 10 marks	Objective/Multiple Choice
Section B	5 Questions - 5x3 marks = 15 marks	Short Answer
Section C	5 Questions - 5x10 marks = 50 marks	Descriptive

- 4) **Classification of Successful Candidates**
- a) A candidate must secure a minimum of 40% of marks (equivalent Grade 'C') in each paper. Grading shall be based on marks obtained in both internal assessment and end semester examination.
- b) The marks obtained by a candidate in all six semesters shall be taken into account while declaring the results.
- c) Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) shall be awarded on the basis of marks obtained in each semester.
- d) Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) shall be awarded on the basis of grades obtained in all the semesters.
- e) Grade Card, based on the grades earned, shall be issued to all the registered students after every semester along with SGPA of that semester and CGPA earned till that semester.
- f) The Final Grade Point (FGP) shall be awarded on the basis of CGPA secured by the candidate.

However, students may be able to change Core Subject before starting V Semester, provided that those who want to change their Core must obtain 55% to the subject where they want to shift their Core and the student must not have any back paper.

## **FACILITIES OF THE COLLEGE**

### **1) Library**

The College has a well-equipped library with a collection of different books and journals. The college library is operating with one Librarian and three staff members. The library provides the following resources:

- a) Total number of books is 17980 as on 17th June, 2021
- b) Subscribes 24 english journals and 6 monthly magazines, 6 national daily english newspaper and 8 local daily newspapers.
- c) The college library joins N-LIST INFLIBNET since 2010.
- d) The college library provides services and utility to e-journals (full text) and e-books.
- e) Computerised Bibliographic Catalogue search facility is provided.
- f) Barcode Scanner in circulation is done and CCTV installed.
- g) e-Repositories provide online and offline browsing accessible from other countries.
- h) Smart cards are issued to members.
- i) The college library has 20 seat capacities of internet computer facilities for students, assisted by computer operator and instructor.
- j) Borrower must make good the loss by replacing library material with same or latest edition.

### **2) College Bus**

The college provides transportation to and from the campus and for important field trips as and when necessary.

### **3) Water Tank**

The college has two large water tanks with a capacity of 2.1 lakh litres for water storage and rain water harvesting.

### **4) Ecology Park**

The college has the Ecology Park within the campus which is maintained and looked after by the Ecology Club.

### **5) Mini Gym**

The Mini Gym has been installed at the campus for fitness enthusiasts.



**6) Basket Ball-cum-Volley Ball Court**

The college has the Basket Ball-cum-Volley Ball Court at the campus.

**7) Cafeteria**

The college has a canteen/cafeteria inside the campus in which a variety of food items are available at nominal rates.

**8) Mentoring**

The Mentoring Programme is taken earnestly. Teaching faculty members are engaged in mentoring the students of their respective department. Informal interactions with the mentees are conducted by the mentors effectively.

**9) Student's Union Office**

The Student's Union Office is an important place for the student community.

**10) Grievances & Disciplinary Committee**

It is headed by the Chairman, a Coordinator and six other members. The Committee looks into the grievances of any faculty and students. The Committee also supervises the rules and regulations of the College.

**11) Sexual Harassment Cell**

The Parliament of India passed the 'Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act' in the year 2013. The Act provides protection against sexual harassment of women at workplace and for the prevention and redressal of complaints of sexual harassment and for the matters connected therewith or incidental thereto. As directed by the Act, the College has constituted a committee called Internal Complaint Committee. The College Internal Complaint Committee comprises six members headed by the Chairperson and a Coordinator.



## **EXTENSION SERVICES OF THE COLLEGE**

### **1) Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU)**

The College has an IGNOU Study Centre since 1989, to impart education and knowledge through various means suited to the Open and Distance Education Mode as per the UGC norms. The College Study Centre offers various courses like Certificate, Diploma, BA (Arts & Commerce), MA degree in different subjects and Post-Graduate Diploma courses.

### **2) National Institute of Electronics & Information Technology (NIELIT)**

The College has a branch of NIELIT at the Sikulpuikawn Main Building since 2013. College students and other interested person from outside can attend the computer class. Triple C {CCC}, Tally and Data Entry System, BCA and MCA courses are offered.

### **3) National Service Scheme (NSS)**

The NSS aims at developing students' personality through community service. The College NSS offers opportunities for volunteers to take part in community services such as tree plantations, voluntary blood donations, anti-drug and AIDS awareness campaigns, fire prevention campaigns, anti-tobacco campaigns.

### **4) National Cadet Corps (NCC)**

The College is affiliated to the parent body of National Cadet Corps. NCC provides the students with many incentives such as certificates and scholarships. Interested students may contact the NCC Cell for enrolment. The College NCC unit functions under the guidance of two Caretaker Officers (CTOs) who conduct trainings and special classes. The unit also participates in the annual NCC Camp and National Camp. Parade contingent from the College NCC unit participates in the annual Republic Day and Independence Day celebrations.

### **5) Youth Adventure Club (YAC)**

The College YAC was founded on August 7, 1982 and registered under the Government of Mizoram Firms and Societies Registration Act in 1988. Affiliated to the National Adventure Foundation (NAF), New Delhi, the Club is the first ever Youth Adventure Club in Mizoram. The Club actively organises various adventure-based activities, explore sites of cultural and historical values and organise training camps.



**6) Literature Club**

The Literature Club was formed on the 10th November 2004 by a group of students with a common interest in literature and writing. The club motto is 'To Uncover and Advance the Works and Skills of Students through Literature'. Enrollment is done at the beginning of every odd semester. Membership is open to any student of the college.

**7) Huiva Cultural Club**

The Huiva Cultural Club was established on the 3th September 2006. The club performs at college functions and take part in cultural festivals organised in and outside Mizoram. Members meet and practise on Mondays and Thursdays after classes. The club continues to work closely with the Social and Cultural Department of the Students' Union.

**8) Consumer Club**

The Consumer Club is an initiative of the Government of India. It was introduced at the college in the 2007-2008 sessions. It aims to educate students about rights of the consumers as provided in the Consumer Protection Act, 1986 and mobilise youngsters by instilling in them the spirit of protection of consumer rights.

**9) Students' Self Support Union (SSU)**

The Students' Self Support Union, Government Aizawl College Branch was established on the 1st August 2012 with fully elected office bearers and a membership enrollment. The Union helps its members in finding gainful employment and prices itself on adherence to the value and dignity of labour.

**10) UGC Insurance Programme**

The UGC Insurance Programme is an initiative of the Department of Commerce. It was started in the year 2012. Currently, it offers courses for Certificate, Diploma and Advanced Diploma. The course is a career-oriented project to help students gain knowledge and skills needed to help them prepare for insurance examinations.

**11) Ecology Club**

The Ecology Club was formed on the 20th September 2018. It is programme under the Mizoram Pollution Control Board and they are the sponsoring agency. It aims to create awareness on environmental issues. The club conducts various environmental related activities.



**12) Art Club**

The College Art Club was formally started on the 1st October 2019 with the hope that this small beginning would encourage and unite art lovers and enthusiasts in the student community and contribute to a meaningful honing of their talents and skills.

**13) Red Ribbon Club**

The Red Ribbon Club (RCC) is affiliated to the Mizoram State AIDS Control Society. RCC is a movement through which the College faculty and students spread awareness on HIV-AIDS. The GAC Red Ribbon Club plays a significant role in creating awareness on drug abuse among the college students under the guidance of Nodal Officers and Peer Educators. The Club organises seminars and workshops, working side by side with MSACS and actively participates in Blood Donation Camp in the college.

**14) Civil Service Aspirants Club**

In pursuance of the decision of the Students' Support & Progression Cell and Career Counselling & Placement Cell, the Civil Service Aspirants Club was formally formed on 27th January 2020. The club focuses on drilling student members of the club in their preparation of exams conducted by the Mizoram Public Service Commission. The club takes up the initiative of hiring Resource Persons or resources in the form of material to help them in their career oriented examinations.

**15) Music Club**

The Music Club, under the aegis of the Social and Cultural Department of the Students' Union was formed on the 16th March 2021. It was set up to encourage and motivate music enthusiasts within the sizeable student community and provide a platform from which participants for inter-college music competitions etc may be selected.

**16) Dance Club**

The Dance Club was set up under the aegis of the Social and Cultural Department of the Students' Union on the 17th March 2021. It is distinct from the college Cultural Club which focuses on cultural dances. The Dance Club centers more on contemporary forms of dance. The club aims to draw in more students with dance skills and talents, and provide a talent pool for selection of cheerleaders during college sporting programmes.



**17) Quiz and Debate Team**

The College Quiz Team and Debate Team began functioning on the 15th March 2021. Since they are not Clubs, membership is not open to all. A few students deemed likely to bring good repute to the college are personally selected on the basis of their academic records and extra-curricular activities. The Quiz Team has ten members, while the Debate Team has five.

**18) Anti-Drug Club**

The college has Anti-Drug Club for augmenting and strengthening the existing awareness programmes and transforming the students in order to tackle the prevailing drugs related problems.

**19) Single Use Plastic Elimination Programme**

It is the initiative of the Central Pollution Control Board and the Mizoram Pollution Control Board is the Nodal Agency in Mizoram. The programme aims to eradicate Single Use Plastic in everyday life.

3. Regular attendance (minimum 75%) is a must to appear in the End-Semester Examination. Leave of Absence must be obtained within one week of joining.
4. Students must carry their College Identity Cards at all times inside the campus.
5. Participation in the extra-curricular programmes is compulsory for the students.
6. Periodical tests and assignments are compulsory aspects of evaluation, and may not be evaded without grave consequence.
7. Ignorance of vital information put on the Notice Board is not a valid excuse for non-compliance.
8. Ragging in any form within the campus is an offence to the institution and to humanity and is liable to disciplinary action to the extent of expulsion from the college.
9. Partisan politics and propagation of their policies, regional and communal interest deterrent inside the campus is strictly prohibited.
10. Abuse of any kind of intoxication, drugs and tobacco, etc. will invite instant action to the extent of dismissal from the college. Peddling of drugs is a crime and subject to legal action.
11. Attempt to exert influence over the college administration for personal benefit is an insult to the academic profession and may jeopardize the interested client.
12. Any kind of extensive meeting or gathering within the college campus without prior permission from the Principal is strictly prohibited.
13. Negligence of personal decency is an offence to the institution and is liable to disciplinary actions.
14. A fee once paid is not refundable without sanction from competent authority.
15. Outsiders are not allowed within the administrative areas.



### **DRESS CODE**

Students are expected to come to college in a decent dress. Extreme hair cuts or extreme hair colour is not permitted. College T-Shirt must be worn compulsorily on Wednesdays and other certain occasions such as College Week, Inter-College Sports and when representing the college.

### **USAGE OF MOBILE PHONES**

Students are not allowed to use their mobile phones during classes and examinations.

Social media should be used with discretion. Students are advised against the use of social media in a malicious or irresponsible way that could bring disrepute or humiliation to the institution or its community (i.e. the faculty, staff, students or anyone associated with the college)

### **DISCIPLINE**

Violation of rules and regulations is punishable by the college authority. All students are informed to abide by the rules and regulations of the college and the Mizoram University norms.
